Indroduction

The work (I stay quiet as a stone), 「from there to here」。 started from a conversation: the project began with interdisciplinary artist Law Yuk Mui and dance artist Gigi Yang writing down their current concerns in the space between () and 「」. Later, they pitched out possible directions and materials, unfolding a personal and mutually stimulating mode of creation with the collision of various media.

Law Yuk Mui lives in Japan, and Gigi Yang has also lived in different cities. The cultural anthropologist Victor Turner once pointed out that when a person moves from one social state to another, the transitional stage he goes through is called the liminal state, a state of ambiguity, chaos and potential. In their work, the two artists attempted to capture this instability that comes with a drastic shift in life. At first glance, the work seems to depict two unrelated statements with its exhibition and dance performances: a state of silence and a wandering path. However, both of these parts subtly reveal the recollection and introspection involved for someone displaced in a foreign land. Law Yuk Mui reassembles everyday objects poetically to record the minute movements of objects, subtle sounds, and associations with the details of daily life, while Gigi Yang uses extremely slow body gestures as a practice of facing the history of her body. In the three performances, three other artists will be invited as artist observers to record and capture Gigi Yang's body practice in three different media. The recorded documents or items will be placed in the exhibition space so that the exhibition will continually evolve during the process.

Similar to viewing a prism from different angles, the works created by the two artists illuminate the gaps and dislocations between themselves and the environment they are in. In the process of constantly throwing ideas, they gradually returned to their feelings and thoughts accumulated from day-to-day observations, piling them up into heavy memories. These ideas are showcased in the trajectory of the movements of materials and bodies.


